Only fruits and vegetables listed under "ALL COUNTRIES" are enterable, subject to inspection. If **not** enterable from "ALL COUNTRIES," then REFUSE ENTRY.

**COCOS (KEELING) ISLANDS**

Only fruits and vegetables listed under "ALL COUNTRIES" are enterable, subject to inspection. If **not** enterable from "ALL COUNTRIES," then REFUSE ENTRY.

<sup>1</sup> If *Sagittaria sagittifolia*, refuse entry unless the importer has a valid PPQ Form 526 Permit. This noxious weed is prohibited by 7CFR 360–Noxious Weed Regulations.

<sup>2</sup> Cartons must be stamped, "Not for importation into or distribution in FL."

<sup>3</sup> Fruits receiving cold treatment may enter at these additional ports: Gulfport, MS; Seattle, WA; and Wilmington, NC.

<sup>4</sup> If the prescribed refrigeration period is met upon arrival, the treated commodity may enter at any port of entry in the U.S. staffed by PPQ. However, if the prescribed refrigeration period is **unmet** upon arrival, then the commodity may enter only at a North Atlantic Port, Gulfport, MS; Seattle, WA; or Wilmington, NC.

<sup>5</sup> Pears must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by the Chinese Ministry of Agriculture stating that "All fruits described in this shipment have been bagged during the entire growing season and within approved sites that have been trapped for the oriental fruit fly with negative results." ←
