IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF CANADA  
FOR FOXES, SKUNKS, RACCOONS, AND FERRETS  
EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES

The animals must be accompanied by a U.S. Origin Health Certificate issued by a veterinarian authorized by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) and endorsed by a Veterinary Services (VS) veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of both the consignor and consignee and complete identification of the animals to be exported. Additional information shall include:

CERTIFICATION STATEMENTS

1. The animals were inspected and found free of evidence of disease.
2. The animals on the premises of origin are free from symptoms of rabies, and rabies has not been diagnosed on the premises of origin for the last 12 months.
3. The animals were born on the premises of origin and were domestically raised.
4. None of the animals kept as breeding stock originated from the wild.

OTHER INFORMATION

1. A permit must be obtained from Agriculture Canada before exportation of the above animals.
2. Pet foxes, skunks, raccoons, and ferrets temporarily entering Canada in the possession of U.S. citizens do not require a prior permit or health certificate.
