**IMPORT HEALTH REQUIREMENTS OF PERU FOR DOGS AND CATS EXPORTED FROM THE UNITED STATES**

The animals must be accompanied by a health certificate issued and signed by a licensed veterinarian. The certificate shall contain the name and address of the owner, and complete identification of the animal (name, breed, sex and age). In addition the certificate shall show that:

1. The animal(s) were examined within 30 days prior to departure and found to be free of any infectious diseases.
2. The animal(s) were vaccinated against rabies. The vaccine must be given no greater than 12 months and no sooner than 14 days prior to departure. (The rabies vaccination certificate, which should include date of vaccination, product name and serial number, must accompany the health certificate).
3. In the case of dogs, that they were vaccinated against distemper, leptospirosis, hepatitis, parvovirus, and parainfluenza (DHLPP) within the past 12 months prior to embarkation.

Other information:

1. The health certificate must be dated and signed by a licensed veterinarian. The veterinarian's license number must appear on the health certificate.
2. NOTE: Neither Federal endorsement nor Consulate endorsement is required for personal dogs or cats.
